GUIDELINES FOR REVIEW OF SCHOLARSHIP

1. Acceptance and publication of a Triological Society thesis in laryngology or closely related field is considered a foundational demonstration of scholarship and is expected with rare exception subject to Council review.
2. Active Fellow candidates will demonstrate scholarship, service, education and/or innovation in the field of laryngology such as:
 - a. A series of peer-reviewed publications as first or senior author on a focused topic in laryngology or related field that has significantly advanced clinical practice or scientific insight.
 - b. Service as principal investigator on a competitive research award, for a project directly related to laryngology or a closely allied discipline.
 - c. Development of major educational programs and pathways in laryngology.
 - d. Demonstration of service to the American Laryngological Association and the field of laryngology, such as: service as an editor or on an editorial board of journals related to laryngology; service on committees, councils, or study sections focused on advancing the field of Laryngology; consistent contribution of high-quality reviews for the Association's official journal, The Laryngoscope, sustained over a number of years; sustained and substantial contribution to the Association as a Post-Graduate member.
3. Candidates will submit a personal statement describing their contributions in scholarship and innovation in laryngology, major contributions to laryngology education, and service to the Association and the field of laryngology, not to exceed one page.
